As a result of the outstanding performances from our participants in the 2024 WESPA Championship (note change of name for 2025), especially with David Eldar becoming World Champion for the second time, Australia has gained an extra place for the Championship to be held in Ghana in 2025, making a total of 14 place (plus David). If you are interested in representing Australia, keep it in mind as there could be places for those rated lower down the list. Remember, you have to be a financial member of your local ASPA organisation to be eligible.

## **WESPA RATINGS REVISION**

Over the last year or so, Russell Honeybun (Australia) and Yong Jian Rong (Singapore) have been doing an analysis of the WESPA ratings system and working on a revision to the algorithm that will, among other improvements, more accurately depict the ratings of youth players, who are currently systemically underrated.

The WESPA Committee reviewed this work at the WESPA Executive meeting in July and approved a plan to implement these changes. The new 'RJR" system for WESPA ratings will be calculated alongside the current ratings for the end of 2024, and become official on January 1, 2025. At this time there will be discontinuity in ratings as the ratings from the new RJR system replace the ratings from the current system.

The RJR system is based on the Glicko-2 rating system, using an additional "ratings deviation" factor to allow ratings for newer or quickly improving players to change faster than ratings for long-established players. Russell and Jian Rong have put together an overview with individual case studies comparing the system wth existing WESPA ratings as well as a longer, more technical whitepaper describing the algorithm. Both of these items will be published to the WESPA website.

The adjustment to the WESPA rating system addresses some long-standing problems. Chris Lipe (WESPA Chairperson) and Jian Rong started working on something similar a decade ago, and we are grateful to Russell and Jian for carrying on this excellent work.

## **Tournaments**



The Tournament on 21 September 2024 yielded the following results from 8 games: 1st John Span (7 wins); 2nd Noel Barrett (6 wins); and 3rd Tim Reddan (4 wins). High game honours were shared between John Spaan and Tim Reddan (513). High word was claimed by Tim Reddan for EMPTIEST (102).

Due to various absences, we had a small turnout for the Tournament on 19 October 2024. Place-getters were John Spaan 1st with 7 wins, Tim Reddan 2nd with 5 wins, and Caroline Scowcroft 3rd with 4 wins. High game went to John Spaan (530) and high word to Terry Horan HANDIEST (149).

The 2024 ACT Scrabble Championship was held across 2 days, Saturday 16 and Sunday 17 November 2024 and attracted 14 competitors.

It was great to welcome several competitors from outside of the ACT, including provisional Junior Scrabble player, Oliver Klistorner, from Sydney. A last-minute entry on day 1 and two



dropouts to start day 2 made the draw a bit chaotic but we got there. Many thanks to Rebecca Hill who came along for 4 games on Sunday afternoon which ensured no one had to have a 2nd bye.

Well done to Tony Hunt for winning (13 wins out of 16 games), John Spaan (13 wins), John Hamilton (11 wins) and to Terry Horan on reaching an all-time ratings peak (1021). High game went to Phillip Hamilton (637) and high word to Madeleine Emerson for SETTLING (104).

## **New South Wales**

## **Tournament Summary**

The major event staged by Scrabble NSW during the quarter was the three-day New

South Wales Championship. This year we moved back to the Magpies Waitara Club, largely due to the unavailability of the Revesby Workers Club. We also included a one-day event on the Sunday for those not wishing to play all three days. 36 players took part in the championship and 11 in the one-day event.

The winner of the event was Edward Okulicz from Victoria, making it seven titles since his first in 2005. He won with 17 wins over Jane Taylor from South Australia, also on 17 wins but with a lower spread. In third place on 16 wins was local Rod Talbot. Judy Mansfield, also from South Australia recorded the high word score with **REQUIRES** for 203, while up and comer Josh Watt notched up high game score and a national record for this year with 720.

In the one-day event Stephen Morrow was the winner with 6 wins of 7 games over Ivor Zetler who fell at the last hurdle to narrowly miss a clean sweep.

Two weeks later we were at Club Burwood RSL for the annual Scrabble NSW Spring Marathon. Twelve 20 minutes per player games were played, with eventual winner being Rod Talbot losing only one game to Victor Tung. Organizer Josh Watt was runner up with 10 wins and Bob Jackman finished in third place with 9 wins. John Holgate registered the high game of 539 while Janine Whittaker's BOXIEST for 113 was the high word score of the day.

The most recent event in the quarter was the Wallerawang Tournament, organised and run by Phillip Hamilton and family. Wallerawang is a lovely township, just west of Lithgow, with superb amenities including the bowling club where the event was staged. 20 players made

the trip west from Sydney and north from Canberra, plus Melbournite Rob Hutchinson. Joanne Craig celebrated her birthday in style winning all her games on Day 1 (the actual birth day) and losing only to Caroline Scowcroft on Day 2, to regain her Central West Champion title. Runner up was the consistent Road Talbot with 11 wins with Bob Jackman in third place on 10 wins. Peter Shaw made the short trip from Oberon to collect the high word prize with **GRAFTERS** for 149.

## **Matchplay Progress**

Both A and B Matchplay have reached the same stage where one game is left to decide the two finalists. In Matchplay A Esther Perrins and John Holgate face off to see who will play Bob Jackman in the final, while in Matchplay B, Steven Savona and Andrew Smith will play off for the right to take on Asanka Dissanayake in the final.

## **New Committee Structure**

At the AGM held during the NSW Championship, the new committee for the year was decided. Julie Bailey, convenor of Lane Cove Club, is our new Secretary, Josh Watt replaces Steven Savona as Vice President and Steven now takes on the rile of Publicity Officer.

#### Joan Rosenthal Award

This year's Joan Rosenthal award was won by youth player Nathan Tang, who recorded the highest rating gain of 273 points between consecutive State Championships. The award has been conferred every year since 1999.

Youth scrabble continues to grow in Queensland with Ashwin Page and Danira De Silva going to the Australian Junior Championships in Sydney and the World Youth Scrabble Championships in Sri Lanka. The scrabble masterclass at Brisbane State High School went well with around 25 students attending the after-school sessions. Six students have attended tournaments from this group.

Queensland Scrabble is participating in the Australian Scout Jamboree being held at the Maryborough Showgrounds in January with 9,000 scouts attending. We are running a Scrabble Tent in the Your Discovery (STEM activities) section. The team will be Olga

Visser, Karrin Henderson, Karen Richards, Paul Richards and Josh Watt (NSW). We will be offering activities of Classroom (Scrabble training), Challenge (Scrabble master plays up to 10 scouts at once), Free Play (Scouts play Scouts), Anagrams (make words from tiles exposed), and a Quiet Zone (Word Search puzzles etc.). We expect around 60 to 80 scouts in each of the 14 three-hour sessions, plus one evening session run for leaders.

The Queensland Yearly Tournament Prize has been restricted to just Individuals, with the club competition discontinued. ## Western Australia

August saw Western Australia host the fourth edition of the Glenys Lawrie Memorial Open. Defending champion Russell Honeybun won for the second time with six wins and a whopping 1141 point margin, as well as High Game of 652. Russell scored five bingos in

one game including **INSHRINE** for 176 points – but it was not enough for High Word, as Jenny Coetzee powered through with 'machines' for a whopping 212 points in one of Jenny's games. A tournament featuring a plethora of points!

September in Australia saw a major event occur in the Scrabble calendar in the form of the Australian Masters and State Team Challenge. Seven Western Australian representatives made the pilgrimage to Adelaide, South Australia in pursuit of Scrabble glory. The Masters tournament saw David Vanzyl finish 11th, Russell Honeybun at 14th, Chris Hall at 16th and Max Mason at 18th within a field of 20 top-notch Scrabblers. The State Team Challenge featured three players representing Western Australia where a trophy was decided by the combined performance of each individual from a particular state (or territory). Benjamin Lee scored 13 wins to finish in 2nd place in individual standings, only missing out on first place by margin, in a performance well exceeding expectations as evidenced by a 121 rating points gain. Ian Ting scored 9 wins for 10th place and Sally Martin scored 8 wins for 14th place. In total, Western Australia claimed 30 wins to place equal 3rd among the participating states (and territories), which resulted in merely missing out on 1st place and the State Team Challenge trophy by a single win!

The Bassendean tournament occurred on the weekend after the Masters and State Team Challenge and featured various prizes up for grabs such as biscuits, dragées, and of course, wine. Some of the prizes were given out via raffles. The tourney featured a Word of the Day with the highest scoring words in each round starting with each letter in the word **LIBRARY** being awarded a prize. Louise Love had **LISPERS** for 67, Rhonda Reynish had INSTALLS for 74. Anne Zion had BUNT for 27, Judy Godfrey had REMINDED for 74, Naomi Zion had AGONIZED for 88, Ian Ting had **RONDEAU** for 66, and lan also had **YOK** for 29. Prizes were also awarded for Most Unusual Word with Jenny Coetzee in Division B for **ESTRONE** and Ian Ting in Division A for **AEOLIPILE**. More prizes were given in Division B to Carol Hudson (3rd), Bettina Tonkin (High Word and 2nd) and Cori Lodder

(High Game and 1st), and in Division A to Anne Zion (High Game), Jegatheva Jegathesan (3rd), Russell Honeybun (High Word and 2nd) and Ian Ting (1st). Many thanks to Anne Stewart, Vera Etherton and the Bassendean Scrabble Club for the organisation of the event.

A special and unusual Scrabble competition unaffiliated with ASPA was organised by Ross Macpherson and was held for the first time on the evening of 16 September at H&C Urban Winery, a bar and restaurant in Fremantle, The organiser is passionate and enthusiastic about the game of Scrabble, and offered \$500 for the winner of that evening's competition plus spot prizes in various categories. It was a fun and guite challenging night that featured 24 players from all walks of life engaging in a four-player game of Scrabble. One of the challenges was that each player had 1 minute to make their play, and another was that there was a 10 point penalty for incorrect challenges. The winner of the competition was determined based on the aggregate score for each player after 3 rounds of Scrabble. Most of the attendees were seemingly unknown to the people who regularly participate in ASPA clubs and tournaments, which made for a great networking opportunity. Ultimately, the winner of the \$500 prize was not a member of ASPA. All of the attendees enjoyed the event and looked forward to having the event organised again in the future.

On 6 October, a Bisection tournament was held at our usual venue in South Perth. Division A was won by Anne Zion with 6 wins out of 7. Anne also played the highest word with 'episode' for 107, whilst David Vanzyl recorded High Game with 627. This was a remarkable game that included 6 bonus words - FAUNIST 78, ISOLATE 75, LOUVRED 77, AEGIRITE 72, ALLERGEN 72 and INDUCIAE 83. In another game, Benjamin Lee managed 4 consecutive bonus words -INVITERS 62, DUNGIEST 63, ACETONE 86 and HOTLINER 63. Scrabble WA welcomed a visitor from Victoria, Shaun Donnelly, playing an ASPA WA tournament for the first time. Division B saw a player in his first ASPA tournament, Andrew Thorpe, who appeared new to the regular tournament players. although was not new to playing Scrabble, as he acquitted himself well achieving a couple

of wins. However, Division B was won by Cori Lodder with 6 wins, who also had High Game of 512 and High Word, **FLARIEST** for 131.

The trip from Melbourne to Sri Lanka takes around 11 hours, plus any time spent waiting for connecting flights.

With flights getting in around midnight Sri Lankan time, it makes for a long day. The venue for this year's World Youth Scrabble Championship is about 90 minutes from the airport in Colombo and by the time we reached that destination, we found ourselves in line with at least two other Scrabble delegations looking to check in just after 2am Sri Lankan time.

Reception at Citrus Waskaduwa is open air and every room had an ocean view from the ground floor up.

136 young players from 15 countries spent three days playing 24 games to determine who would be this year's Champion.

Australia sent three players as its delegation and with its place at the top of the list alphabetically meant Oscar Ivanovski, Ashwin Page, and Danira Da Silva were the first to be featured in the Opening Ceremony. Sri Lanka's Scrabble Association were a young, dynamic team putting together an enjoyable weekend of play for youngsters and adults alike, as a much smaller delegation played out the WYSC Side event at the same time.

At the other end of the function room that made up the playing arena, teams from Pakistan and Thailand were selling Scrabble merchandise whilst India were promoting the upcoming Asia Youth Cup that has recently completed. A photographer was selling pictures of players during games to interested parties (and parents). Coaches that were not playing sat patiently waiting for their delegations to leave the playing area.

The weather outside was humid, with the temperature well regulated in both players' rooms and the playing venue. The hotel itself offered buffet meals showcasing a wide range of food catering to many tastes.

The conditions were catered just right to make the Scrabble as smooth as possible.

Six scores over 600 were recorded, with the highest being India's Suyash Manchali's 631 in Round 19. A further 127 scores exceeded 500! It took to Round 23 for Ashwin hitting

the highest score for an Australian with 559. Oscar hit 501 in Round 3.

By the end of Day 1, 4 Pakistanis and 1 Indian player made up the top 5. Australia's three players sat 18th, 79th, and 129th. Pakistan's Ahmed Salman was undefeated on Day 1, leading his fellow countryman Affan Salman by one game. Affan's only game dropped that day was to Ashwin in Game 2.

Day 2 featured moves up and down the leaderboard. By day's end, Affan and Ahmed swapped positions to lead on 14-3. India's Suyash Manchali was the sole non-Pakistan player in the top 5. Just outside the top 5 was Sri Lanka's Adheesha Dissanayake. Our players sat 38th, 107th, and 131st respectively.

One of the fascinating aspects to WYSC relates to how prominently some countries feature their younger players. Long time followers of world Scrabble would be well aware of the extent of Pakistani players on the scene. More countries are making an effort to

generate interest in Scrabble from young players.

Scrabble Associations and their coaches display an extensive passion for their players and the game; you can see what it means to see their delegations succeed.

Kenya sent a delegation of 13 players. Delegations from Thailand, Qatar and Nigeria (along with India and the host nation Sri Lanka) showed their Scrabble nations start early too.

The number one seed for this event was from India, the number two seed from the UK.

For young players to succeed, integration with the adult scene seems to yield positive results.

India's Madhav Kamath came into the event having won the 18th All India Scrabble Open and finishing 3rd at the Mumbai National Scrabble Championship.

The UK's Sam Crispin started playing major event Scrabble in May 2023, and had featured well in this year's MGI International Scrabble Classics, the ABSP Nationals and the BMSC in the lead up to this year's WYSC.

They would end up 4th and 5th respectively in Sri Lanka.

The final day continued the drama. Oscar won his first 5 games of the day, Ashwin had his highest game score of the event toward the end of the day. Australia would go on to finish 19th, 56th, and 121st respectively; a

very creditable effort from a team that showed great loyalty and support toward each other.

Pakistan's Affan Salman took out the event, becoming this year's World Youth Champion. He only dropped four matches over the three days. And an Australian was one of those players to beat him!

We have a nascent youth scene in Australia and the overwhelming feeling as we left the playing arena was how great it would be to share this experience with so many other Aussie compatriots. Integrating younger players into adult events and assisting in ways to provide the finances needed to get our players to travel provides young players with a pathway to success on the global stage.

Attending these events gives our players exposure to players in their age bracket, and an international Scrabble network which enriches the experiences of our youth.

After the event, as some players returned home immediately after the event, many stayed on. Oscar caught up with the WYSC runner-up, Suyash, in Galle on a tour... and unsurprisingly, as we ended up at the airport to await our flight home, what did we see?

Some of the players playing Scrabble keeping themselves occupied whilst waiting for their plane! Needless to say, we shared in this experience, a very appropriate way to end what was really a whirlwind tour of an amazing country.

The entire contestant field



The Australian Masters pits the top 20 Australian players (based on eligibility and availability) in a 19-game round robin over two days. At the same venue, the State Team Challenge pits the next top three in each of the six states and ACT (again depending on eligibility and availability) in an 18-game event where each player plays everyone not from their own state or territory. This year the two-day event was held in Adelaide.

In the Masters, David Eldar (VIC), with a pretournament rating of 2130 (nearly 200 points above the next, Naween Fernando (VIC) on 1947), was the obvious favourite.

On the way to coming first, he led for most of the tournament, except for a few early games when Daniel Piechnick (SA) was leading, until Daniel's 7-game initial winning streak ended with a close loss (19 points) to David.

David averaged 474 for each game with an average margin of 93. He dropped only 4 games, to Andrew Fisher (VIC), Trevor Halsall (VIC), Edward Okulicz (VIC) and Esther Perrins (NSW). Esther's win, by 34 points in the last game, was the biggest Masters upset, as her pre-tournament rating was 1755, 375 points below David's. It also contributed to her rating gain of 74, the best for the Masters.

Andrew came second on 14 wins. Esther slipped into third, courtesy of a 424-draw with Edward, that gave her 13.5 wins, but with a lower margin than fourth-placed Daniel on 13 wins. Edward was fifth on 12.5 wins, with Trevor next on 12 wins.

However, placings might have turned out differently if Edward (third-highest rated player, on 1929) hadn't been delayed flying in due to fog at Adelaide airport on the first morning. He missed the first game and arrived partway through the second, although he still won it by over 300.

Trevor took out the high game prize, with 622, the only score over 600. His win against Jane Taylor (SA) led to the second-highest combined score, 1001. The highest combined score, 1006, came from Naween and David Vanzyl (WA) 547–459, helped by Naween's high word discussed below. Of the 190 games

played in Masters, only 10 were won with scores under 400.

The high word score of 163 in Masters was achieved by Naween and John Holgate (NSW). Naween wrapped his rack around EN to make the 9-letter 9-timer of ENLIVENER. He gained an additional 5 points, for a total of 163 points, when his opponent's challenge failed. (Australian rules applied for both Masters and State players, but Masters also had a 5-point penalty for each word unsuccessfully challenged.)

John's word, **PENTACLE**, was also a 9-timer and a failed challenge. The first **E** was on the board, the **T** was doubled, and the **L** was a blank. Rather than splitting the \$100 prize between Naween and John, the organisers decided to award each player \$100.

Some other notable words include John's opening of **YOUNGTH** against David Eldar. Elsewhere, David played **DEUDDARN**, a Welsh cupboard with two tiers (a **TRIDARN** has three tiers) and **YOUVRAY**, a French white wine. Naween turned **ACEIOO?** into **ZOOECIA**, which, not surprisingly, is the only bonus in the rack.

The 5-point challenge rule made a difference at times. For example, Jane could have beaten Andrew if she had not challenged one of his bonus words. Instead, he gained the 5 points and went on to win 463–462. Jane's loss was the third-highest in Masters.

John had the highest loss of 468–489, against Max Mason (WA, but transferring to SA).

In the State Team Challenge, every player plays 18 opponents, but also has one bye to fit the numbers (which gives 19 games, thus neatly aligning with the concurrent Masters). The byes mean that the progressive leaderboard can be more jumpy. Nonetheless, Tony Miller (SA) led nearly all the way.

Before the final game, the three leading on 12 wins were, in order, Tony Miller, Tony Hunt (NSW) and Benjamin Lee (WA). Coincidentally, the two Tonys were matched to play each other. After a mixed first day, Tony Hunt hit his stride on the second day and won every game, including the final one by a strong margin against Tony Miller. So Tony Hunt

came first, while Tony Miller slipped back into third. Benjamin won his final game to slot into second.

Benjamin, with the lowest pre-tournament rating of 1365, had the best rating gain of 121, more than double the gains of other good performers.

Tim Reddan (ACT) had the highest word score of 131 for the 9-timer with **GREETING** through the **R**, and one of the **G**s was a blank. (The other possible 9-timers through the **R** are **GRATINEE**, **ERECTING** and **GREENLIT** (**L** is a blank).)

Jon Ford-King (TAS) had the highest game score of 597, which was also the largest winning margin of 311. John Hamilton (ACT) had the highest loss in his 473–485 game against Antony Kimber (SA).

The pre-tournament ratings of the players in the State Team Challenge averaged just over 1500. The top teams, WA and ACT, had almost identical average ratings of around 1530. In the end, four teams finished very closely. NSW took the trophy with 31 wins, SA was only half a win behind, while WA and ACT tied for third place another half a win behind on 30 wins.

The highest-finishing second player from a team, was Noel Barrett (ACT) in sixth, immediately behind his teammate John Hamilton.

A player mentioned how their opponent opened a game with a phony containing **x** and **z**. Despite successfully challenging it off, the player neglected to check their own play properly, and gave their opponent a place to play **ZEX** for 52. Ouch!

## YouthScrabble Camp, April 2025

Years ago, I ran many YouthScrabble camps in Australia and overseas, from which we directly produced at least four World Youth Champions - Anand Bharadwaj (2011), Michael McKenna (2012), Jack Durand (2014) and Sanchit Kapoor (2016). Alastair and I also did 10 days in Pakistan 2012, from which their YouthScrabble scene has yielded 5 World Champions (2013, 2018, 2021, 2022, 2024). I am certain we have more Australians who are potential World Champions.

To encourage young players (born 2008 or later) to attend the Australian Championship, and also to encourage participation of real beginners who are not interested in the following 3-day Championhip/Plate events, I have organised activities suitable for both groups (experienced youngsters and newbies) during the school holidays. We already have participants booked in from New Zealand and Malaysia.

There are two formal tournaments (maximum 24 players):

**Thursday afternoon** 17th April - for adults and youth

**Friday all day** 18th April - youth only (born 2008 or later)

## Coaching

There are various coaching segments.

**Thursday morning** from 10:30am ((tentative only)

**Thursday evening** - 1.5 hours after tourney - 6:45pm to 8:15pm. (suitable for all levels)

**Friday morning** 1.5 hours prior to tourney - 8:45am to 10:15am (aimed at newbies)

If you know any interested youngsters, please pass on this information so they can book flights early and save money. Coaching itself is free, but is limited to 24 participants. Check before booking flights, in case we have reached that limit (expected to happen by mid-January).
