Collins 2024 Announcement

Announcement on Collins Scrabble Words 2024 Edition, from the WESPA Committee

We are pleased to announce to the Scrabble community that Collins have designated August 15, 2024 as the release date for the updated 2024 edition of Collins Scrabble Words. As with previous releases, Collins will have a discount code for tournament Scrabble players to use when purchasing a physical copy of the book; more details on this will follow.

The WESPA Committee have voted to make this new edition of Collins Scrabble Words effective for tournament play worldwide beginning on January 1, 2025. An Initiation Kit from WESPA on the new words will be available soon after the new edition's release, and we will be working with app developers to

update the word list in their apps. We also expect that an updated version of Collins Zyzzyva will be available in the fall* for word study and adjudication.

We expect this update to contain 1816 additions, with 847 of them being words of length 3-8. There are no anticipated deletions.

I am pleased with this update – I think WESPA's collaboration with Collins went really well, and I'm looking forward to playing with the new words in 2025!

Chris May Memorial Winter Masters

The Chris May Winter Masters over the weekend of 20th and 21st July happened nearly one year since Chris's passing, and just before his daughter Natasha's 1st birthday. To celebrate the occasion, his wife Ksenia had hand-crafted an exquisite perpetual trophy, and visited on the final day with daughter Natasha to present the trophy to the winner.

A GoFundMe campaign was run to source extra funds to be distributed in prizemoney, as would have been Chris's desire, and to make a contribution to Natasha's education. This campaign will be held open for future renditions of the event.

The tournament got off to a slow start with one no show, but luckily a reserve was there to step in. Two Thai players who had registered online had not confirmed their entry and were left out of the initial draw. Our tournament director John Hamilton was able to rejig the draws and play finally got underway half an hour after the scheduled starting time.

A healthy contingent of 46 players took part. Many interstate players made the trip, availing themselves of the onsite accommodation, and the Thai couple were a surprise and welcome showing. One interstate player, Trevor Halsall from Victoria, flew out of the blocks, losing only his tenth and final game on Day 1 to Philip Hamilton.

Trevor would go on and lose three out of 8 on Day 2, but hold on to the win the event due to his superior spread. Also on 14 wins were Nuti Suri from Thailand (2nd) and Edward Okulicz (Vic). Further back on 11 wins and separated narrowly by spread was the organiser Bob Jackman (4th) and relative newcomer Josh Watt (5th).

Sharon Sorensen collected the Rating Band A award for highest finisher in the 1200 to 1500 bracket, with Thai lady Natchaya Sitharo runner up in that band. Tony Kalayzich won

Queensland

In recognition of her long service to Scrabble Queensland, Karrin Henderson was appointed as a Life Member. Karrin has been an active tournament player and committee member since the 1990's. She joins other Scrabble Queensland Life Members Patti Ashwin, Olga Visser and Martin Waterworth.

Scrabble Masterclass sessions resumed in term 3 at Brisbane State High School with 30 students attending the 6-lesson course. Four of the participants from the term 2 masterclass played their first tournament on 6th July and we hope to see even more make their debut on 31st August with the second Mindsport event organized specifically for beginners.

New clubs are operating now at Tangara (West End) and Logan. Three adults from Logan clubs played their first tournament on 6th July.

Preparations and planning continued for Scrabble Queensland to be involved in the Scout Jamboree in January 2025 at Maryborough (Queensland. Over 6,000 scouts from throughout Australia will attend the Jamboree. We expect to have more than 700 scouts participate in the Scrabble activities. We need youth mentors in all states to encourage and support any keen young players after the Jamboree.

The start of the Queensland Championships is the cut off for yearly awards presented in Queensland.

The Highest Rating Gain for 2023-24 in Queensland was won by Ashwin Page with a gain of 269 points.

The 2023-24 Tournament Player of the Year in Queensland is Karen Richards with 144 points. Second was Cameron Farlow with 121 points and third was Kerry Reimers with 106 points. This award recognises a combination of results achieved and attendance at tournaments worldwide.

The 2023-24 Tournament Club of the Year in Queensland is Coorparoo with 367 points. Second was Southport with 264 points and third was Logan Clovers with 211 points. This award recognizes clubs that encourage their members to participate in tournaments.

During the year Queensland players participated in 19 local tournaments, 16 interstate events and 10 overseas tournaments.

Next year the Tournament Prize point structure will be changed slightly with more points being awarded for Novices (10 points – up from 5) and Provisional-rated players (5 points – up from 3). This is to encourage the introduction and retention of newer players to

the tournament scene. The other points remain the same - First (any division/ rating band) 10; Second 8; Third 6; Fourth 4; Fifth 3; Novice 10; Provisional 5; Attending 1. Players can be affiliated with one or more clubs. Any CASPA or Internationally rated tournament is eligible to be counted toward the points tally.

Western Australia

The Western Australian Scrabble Championship was held during the WA Day long weekend. A new state champion was crowned as Ian Ting won fourteen out of eighteen games. Key to this result was two wins versus the tentime defending champion Russell Honeybun who was vying for a sixteenth title and eventually finished third in the tournament with twelve wins, as well as two wins versus the eventual runner-up David Vanzyl who had twelve-and-a-half wins. T

he winner in B Division was Rhonda Reynish who had eleven wins and finished sixth overall. The runner-up in B Division was Louise Love with nine wins, while in third place was John Salmon also with nine wins.

The winner of the High Game category was Judy Godfrey with 543 points, while the High Game in B Division went to Rhonda Reynish with 493 points.

The winner of the High Word category went to Alan Mathews who was also the winner of High Word in B Division with 158 points. The High Word in A Division went to David Vanzyl with 140 points.

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held in early July, followed by a six-game Bisectional tournament. A key motion was passed during the AGM where the five-point unsuccessful challenge rule applied to games in the top division, which had been enacted from the previous year's AGM, was to be discontinued from that day onwards.

The players in the tournament bid farewell to Max Mason who was planning to move interstate and shared a cake amongst the people at the venue. He was also the winner of the tournament with five wins out of six and had High Word with 94 points.

The runner-up was Ian Ting with five wins and also had High Game with 501 points. In third place was Benjamin Lee with four wins. The winner in B Division with four wins out of six was Jenny Coetzee, who also had High Game with 461 points.

The runner-up in B Division with four wins was Cori Lodder, who also had High Word with 98 points. This High Word score was also shared with Janet Kirk. In third place with four wins as well was Carol Hudson.

2024 VICTORIAN CHAMPIONSHIP

In 2023, David Eldar took out his fourth Victorian Championship in the lead up to winning the 2023 WESPA Championship in Las Vegas. This year he returned to defend his title.

The Victorian Scrabble Championship is one of the longest running events on the Scrabble Calendar in Australia, run over the King's Birthday long weekend (second weekend in June).

The first Victorian was run in 1985 (the year ASPA Vic was founded) as a replacement for the cancellation of the Moomba Championship, with Arleigh Receptions being the venue 80 players took part (including four from NSW (Don Croft, John Barker, Jean McGiffen, and Dulcie Lyall).

It was a 10 game event; Lynne Butler won the inaugural title, from Jean McGiffen and Jack Mack. Moya Jury was victorious in B Division and Bil Scott in C.

1986 saw the event move to a two day event (a first in Victoria) and the introduction of clocks for the Masters Division (also a first). Merrimu Reception Rooms in Murrumbeena was the venue. Five interstate players took part. Dennis Boon took the title of Victorian Champion, with Janet Roberts and John Collins taking out the lower Divisions.

The Olympic Hotel in Preston played host to its second Victorian Championship; the previous year was found to be an enjoyable venue after hosting a previous AMSTC.

This year featured 41 players, including players from interstate, and three players from overseas: the event was the first WESPA rated event for Indonesia's Albert Martono since 2016

Two days. 16 games. A reduction in games from 2023.

There was another change – this time to the system that determined the draw. The draw could be adjusted from the Australian format for players in contention (ie at the top of the draw only) in Games 15 and 16 to ensure as many players stay in contention for placings. Gibsonization may be used if the overall winner is confirmed with no chance of being overtaken.

This was a welcome amendment to the event and we found it an innovation that can easily be applied to other prominent events on our calendar!

To the games themselves, we had ten individual game scores over 540, with three exceeding 600 (John Hamilton's 625 ended up with the High Game score for the weekend – ahead of David Eldar's 609 and 605).

John may have scored 625 and, although he features in the Highest Combined game for the event, it was a 525-448 win over Oscar Ivanovski in Game 2 which took out that accolade. Oscar's 448 was also the highest losing score for the event (3 ahead of Trevor Halsall).

At the end of Day 1, David Eldar and Edward Okulicz led with 7 games won from 8.

(David's sole loss on the day was to Christie Godby in Game 7. Christie's win was the biggest in terms of ratings upsets, with her Round 13 win over Geoff Wright the third biggest, bookending Doreen Ivanovski's win over Rod Talbot in Round 11.)

A further four players were on 6 (Arnold Appelhof, Christie Godby, Shaun Donnelly, and John Holgate) battling closely behind.

It was at this stage, the draw was reset.

By Round 12, David had played his first repeat against both Edward Okulicz and Shaun Donnelly. His Round 12 return win against Christie saw him up by 1 from Edward.

Round 13 saw both David and Edward lose their games; (David to Albert and Edward to

Karen). David had maintained a one game lead (and spread) since Round 9 heading into Rd 14

It was here where the adjusted draw came into its own. Instead of playing someone lower down the ratings (as is usual at similar stages in other events), David and Edward were pitted together a third time.

Edward wins, and we were back to an even race; David wins and he would be unbeatable. The game had a close enough ending, with David securing his FIFTH title by winning 456-412.

As a result, for the first time in recent memory at Victorian events, Gibsonization (the effective withdrawal of the player confirmed as an unbeatable winner) was applied and David had a bye in the final round as the remaining. With a far superior spread, Edward Okulicz was also given a bye as six players effectively vied for the remaining 2 prizes at the top of the leaderboard.

It was a battle of the Johns as Holgate and Hamilton played for the second time in the event; Karen played Oscar. Depending on how these results went, the Kashi Thiris v Albert Martono result had a chance of sneaking into fourth.

The final round saw John Hamilton secure some revenge against John Holgate after a loss at the end of Day 1, winning 393-340. Oscar's 413-379 against Karen saw him with the best spread of the 6 players on 10, behind David, Edward, and John Hamilton.

So, David made it 5 Vic Championships to his name! Going by the numbers, here is how he won it.

Games won: 13 Spread: 1661

Who Is the Western Australian Scrabble Champion?

Ian Ting has written this autobiographical piece about his Scrabble journey. If you have a similar story to tell, please send it in to the ATB editor, or contact them if you would like to discuss.

Well, it is not what you would likely expect based on the past. The new champion having defeated the ten-time defending champion twice in the 2024 edition of the championship, leading to a total of 14 wins out of 18.

He did not play Scrabble while growing up, having only gained interest after watching the television program *Letters and Numbers* on SBS in 2010. He found out he could find lengthy words from a jumbled group of letters

and learn new words quickly while watching the program. He began playing in face-to-face tournaments in 2015 and has been to the Causeway Challenge in 2016 at Johor Bahru, Malaysia, the Australian Championship a few times, and represented Western Australia at the State Team Challenge a few times.

His highest game score ever in a ASPA-rated tournament was 602 while his highest word score ever was 167 on two separate occasions.

He has been told that Scrabble is all about vocabulary, that success in Scrabble is all based on vocabulary and all that matters in Scrabble is vocabulary. He thinks that those

people have not seriously tried playing Scrabble, as he believes that success in the game is based on a combination of a wide range of certain attributes such as vocabulary, spatial awareness, a sense of geometry, probability, recognising a general pattern of spellings, being in the moment and adapting to the current situation, and of course, some luck. He does not believe that success in Scrabble is all about knowing off by heart the most words in the English language.

Ever heard of your opponent demanding you to answer "what does that mean?" after you played a word on the Scrabble board? Well, he has as well, on many occasions.

Of course, he did not invent those words he just played. He usually does not bother learning the meanings of words as word meanings do not affect the scoring or the state of the game at all.

He notices that many words and their associated meanings originated from all kinds of people from around the world. He also notices that many words originating from many centuries ago have since been evolved into different spellings yet have kept the same meaning.

He finds that many of the meanings of those obscure words could be easily expressed with more or less the same meaning with more familiar words that are more prevalently used in the society he lives in.

He believes that anyone trying to learn the meanings of all those obscure words will make their lives more difficult for themselves. He then asks if it is really necessary to be learning and memorising all the meanings of the words he plays on the Scrabble board, or that he is supposed to as demanded by some of his opponents.

Sometimes, he invents his own meanings on the spot to help remember those words!

He has been told that one should only play the words they know are words on the Scrabble board. Well... he does not think so! He is quite sure that all the words playable in Scrabble are not necessarily the same as the words an individual knows.

He sometimes guesses words. Who knows... he might just guess correctly! He encourages anyone playing Scrabble to be brave and have a go at stepping out of your comfort zone to try words they are not too familiar with. Surprises may await.

He is glad that he is playing Scrabble and engaging with the Scrabble community. If he could be the winner of a Scrabble championship, it proves that success in Scrabble is not decided based on an individual's particular attributes such as where they are from, what colour they are, how tall they are, how wide they are, how popular they are, what they are wearing, what they like or dislike about the world, how chatty they are, how loud they are when they talk, or what championship titles they have won before.

For anyone who doubts they could be successful in Scrabble, never lose hope and never give up.

He notices that Scrabble has been going for decades and will be going on forever into the future. He is quite sure that everyone who plays Scrabble will not be going on forever, and neither will he.

The thought of playing Scrabble for his entire life does not work well for him. He has been engaging in other hobbies recently such as performing in an orchestra and going to a chess club once every week.

He is thankful of receiving a three-figure sum from the state championship – it is merely £44.999 million short of matching King Charles's recent pay raise. The three-figure sum will surely help with the current cost of living – it will cover the cost of one piccolosized latte at the local cafe.

The trophy for the state championship has the previous winners' name engraved on it. His name is on there. It will stay there into the future. Is anyone out there going to advise him how to win Scrabble from now on?

Language

Tim Reddan

The English have no respect for their language, and will not teach their children to speak it...It is impossible for an Englishman to open his mouth, without making some other Englishman despise him.

George Bernard Shaw (1912) in the Preface to Pygmalion

Student: 'Professor is it "PLATYPUSES" or "PLATYPI"?'

Professor: 'To even ask the question bespeaks ignorance of three languages.'

The plural of platypus is **PLATYPUSES**. The next most correct usage is **platypodes***, but this form is rarely used today and not valid in CSW21. As for the commonly used word **PLATYPI**? Well, English is an evolving language, and common usage sometimes dictates a word's acceptance so it does appear in CSW21. **OCTOPUS** also has a similar Greek origin and CSW21 allows all three plurals: **OCTOPUSES**, **OCTOPI** and **OCTOPODES**.

Even some words with Latin origins can be incorrectly pluralised. For example, the Latin word *ignoramus* which means "we take no notice of, we do not know", is the first person plural present indicative of *ignorare** "not to know, take no notice of". This legal term was one a grand jury could write on a bill when it considered the prosecution's evidence insufficient. **IGNORAMUS** meaning "ignorant person" came from the title role in George Ruggle's 1615 play, *Ignoramus*, satirizing the ignorance of common lawyers. The plural is **IGNORAMUSES** as it never was a noun in Latin. Despite all that, the plural **IGNORAMI** is, somewhat ironically, allowed in CSW21.

In the Scripps National Spelling Bee contestants are allowed to ask about the language (or languages) of origin of a word when they are about to attempt to spell it. I wonder how helpful such knowledge might be for learning more Scrabble words. Philip Gooden (2016) notes in his book May We Borrow Your Language?:

The English language that is spoken by one billion people around the world is a linguistic mongrel, its vocabulary a diverse mix

resulting from centuries of borrowing from other tongues. From the Celtic languages of pre-Roman Britain to Norman French; from the Vikings' Old Scandinavian to Persian, Arawak, Sanskrit, Cantonese, Hawaiian, Hebrew, Inuit and Urdu – amongst a host of others – we have enriched our modern language with such words as tulip, barbecue, nirvana, ketchup, ukulele, shibboleth, kayak and khaki.

I am of the opinion that rote learning of word lists is quite boring. So anything that might spice up the word knowledge acquisition process may be of use. For example some people like to make lists of names that are also valid Scrabble words (e.g. ABIGAIL, CHRISTIAN, HARRY, PETER, STEVEN), or places (e.g. CHILE, CHINA, JAPAN, PARIS, SPAIN), or nationalities (e.g. CHINESE, ENGLISH, FRENCH, GERMAN).

People outside of the Scrabble playing community think that the English used in Scrabble is quite arcane. There are limited opportunities for one to use **EUOI** in a sentence. I played Woogles' Steelbot the other day and it played some unusual words against me. Here are four of the fives:

AGOGE (tempo in Greek music)

HIKOI (Maori – to take part in a protest march)

IODIC (pertaining to iodine, as applied to an acid)

QAPIK (a monetary unit of Azerbaijan, one hundredth of a manat)

I note that these words all hail from outside English but have been appropriated. I am unsure if my unfamiliarity with Steelbot's words would be less if I had studied Greek, Maori, or Azerbaijani (or Azeri, also referred to as Azeri Turkic or Azeri Turkish). The problem, of course, is knowing which words have been made English and which words haven't. The opportunity arises to make another list of valid Scrabble words that come from a specific foreign language – i.e. all the Maori words, or all the Greek (I expect the number of Azerbaijani words to be much more limited).

Here're some Maori origin words for you to find:

- AAAIKKR
- 2. AHIM
- 3. AAGNOT
- 4. AAARTTU
- 5. AAHNUW

On a somewhat pessimistic note, given that great Scrabble players are able to play the game in languages in which they are not fluent, I expect that knowing the language of origin of a word may not be all that useful - but it may be fun.

One of the things that makes the official Scrabble word list unique is that it constantly evolves just as language does, keeping relevant to the **ZEITGEIST** (19 points!). Every few years, Scrabble game enthusiasts around the world get excited as the next update to our list of permissible words is published – and it's time to get stuck into Collins Official SCRABBLETM Words 2024!

The team at Collins works hard to ensure that the list is up to date and reflects modern usage as much as possible. With huge changes in tech, social interaction and communication style, it won't come as a surprise to you to learn that this time around we've got some absolute beauties of words entering the fray of the competitive Scrabble game. Whether totally new (such as the delightful **GLAMAZON** – a glamorous, physically strong woman), reflecting new usage of an older word (ADULT is now a verb, to behave like an adult) or testifying to the occasionally odd development of the language (uwu anyone?), there are treasures in here guaranteed to help any keen player to take their game to the next level.

I've picked out a selection of the new words to whet your appetite ...

Hooks

Firstly, let's start with what we call "hooks" – when you can add a single letter to another word already on the board to create another word:

AHADITH – same meaning as **HADITH**, the body of tradition about Muhammad

MPOX – a disease like smallpox (a terrible disease, but also a unique new hook)

BACNE – you guessed it, acne on the back **BOPO** – body positivity

NGRAM – a unit of n words, letters or symbols in sequence in text

Modernisms

Next, we've got some really interesting modernisms. Love 'em or hate 'em, they get used every day:

BOUJEE – also **BOUJIER**, **BOUJIEST**, **BOUGIE**, **BOUGIER**, **BOUGIEST** – having bourgeois tastes and attitudes (although I have a feeling **BOUJEE** may be better known than bourgeois nowadays!)

FLOOF – informal name for a furry animal. If you've ever been on social media, you'll have been assaulted by **FLOOFS** on all sides!

GANK/NERF – these two I've bunched together because, as a computer gamer, I was always surprised they weren't included sooner. **GANK** means to steal, and **NERF** means to reduce the effectiveness of something.

owo/uwu – again, two I've combined as they have a similar origin. owo is an expression of surprise, used in text messaging, and uwu is an expression of admiration for something cute in social media. Look at the letters and imagine they were a face ...

PENG – also **PENGER** and **PENGEST** – excellent **TOMOZ** – tomorrow – great new high-value **Z** word!

Low Point Sevens

Thirdly – and here's a free tip! – competitive players often focus on learning 7-letter words that only contain single point tiles (or maybe with one higher value letter). These make up the majority of 7-letter words ... essential for getting those 50-point "bingo" bonuses for using all your tiles. Here are a few new ones which I'm FANBOYING (that's also new...!) over:

ALTCOIN - a type of digital currency

AMIRITE – "Am I right?"... and this new anagram of **AIRTIME** is likely to come in handy, amirite?? – **AMIRIGHT** is also good.

SEALION – this is actually a MASSIVE addition and probably one of the most common phonies – words that aren't permissible – I've seen inexperienced players trip up on. **ANISOLE** finally has its anagram

STANNED – from **STAN** – to follow obsessively the career of a famous person, just like in that song you've probably heard!

THRENOI – new plural of **THRENOS**, an ode for the dead

Hold On!

And finally, here are a few I classify under the heading of "hold on ... they weren't already allowed?". You've probably used these words or come across them A LOT. And yep, they're now allowable!

ANYHOO - anyhow

AUTOFILL – to automatically insert (previously entered information) into blank fields in online forms

BLONDIE – a small square of vanilla-flavoured cake (I've seen this one played in error multiple times in tournaments in the past!)

COVID – it's lost its capital, and something we'd all rather forget is now in the word list. Also its slang counterpart **RONA**

HEADBUTT – surprisingly new. You no longer have to rely on **BUTTHEAD** with these letters!

THINGIE - you know. It's a thingie.

UNDERHIT – believe it or not, you could **OVERHIT** something for a very long time, but not **UNDERHIT** it. I guess eventually our arms had to get tired.

So, there you have it, a few of the words that caught my eye. Personally, I think these new words are going to make a huge difference to my game, so I'm off to start studying!
